

So, for now, in the words of our Great Past Member, Dave Weisel, until we meet On the Road Again, with all my Model "A" Friends, we hope you will join us this year.



Thank you to Greens, Evans, Shaws, George Allison and Marlene Schell.


FIVE POINTS continued:

After feasting on the delicious buffet, we had a short meeting. New officers are:


President: Gary Stewarrt Vice President: Dennis Kempthorne Secretary: Jan Baker Treasurer: Diana Stewart

This photo of my 1930 Fordor Town Sedan is my winter project and I must be honest, it snowballed into a much bigger project than I anticipated. Someone told me once "If its not



broke, don't fix it". I should have listened a little more carefully. This whole project started when I decided to look into getting the fenders painted just to spruce the car up a little.

I stopped at a couple local body shops for quotes and to see what it would take to accomplish my project. The general consensus was the fenders needed more work that what appeared. So, to save some money I removed the fenders, which turned out to be more difficult than it looked. I finally removed them with a little help of a club member. A local body shop told me to purchase new fenders while another shop said they were not bad and he could remove the old lacquer paint and fix them up for me. They are currently in that shop for repair. Stay tuned for the results.

The next step was to fix the center seat adjuster, so I removed the front bench seat. Well,

low and behold, I found the reason the seat wouldn't go back and forth (see photo). Then, I figured since the front seat was out, I would remove the rear seat and carpeting to see what the condition of the floor pans looked like. The upholstery was older and had signs of wear and a little damage so I decided to look into getting the seats and rear fender panels reupholstered. That's another task I didn't expect. Try finding someone who does reupholstering. By now you can see how my winter project has snowballed into a bigger project. One thing I can say for sure is I am determined to get my car ready for the riding season this spring.


