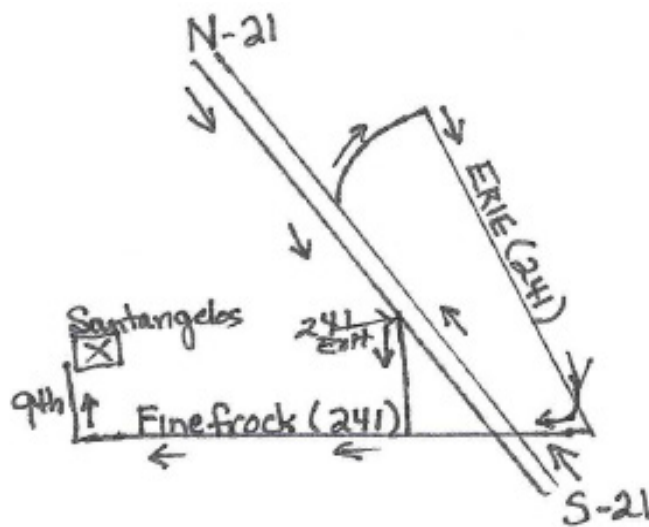

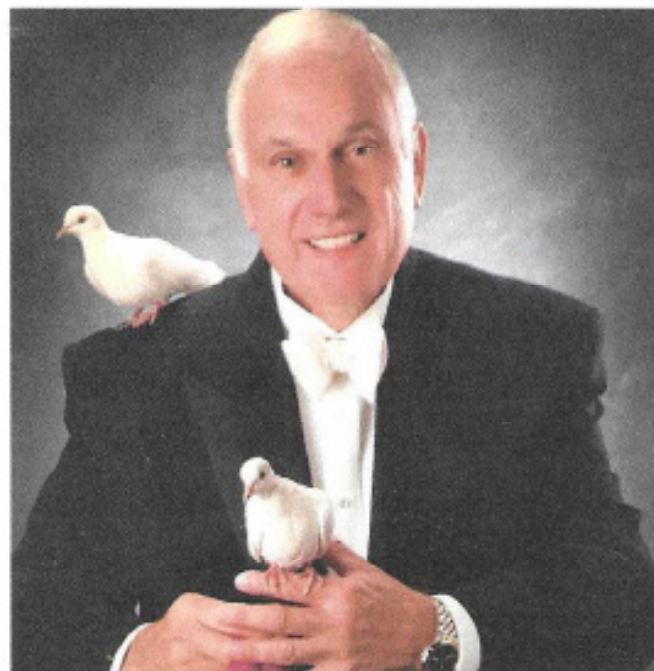

2022 Great Race

The 2022 Great Race will roll through Penn-Ohio territory this year with an overnight stop in Erie, PA on Monday, June 20; a lunch stop in Medina, OH on Tuesday, June 21; and an overnight stop in Perrysburg, OH on Tues., June 21.

The Great Race is a time speed endurance road rally covering 2,300 miles over a nine day time period. The teams traditionally come from all over the world as well as all points of the U.S. Teams, consisting of a driver and a navigator, drive all sorts of vehicles from 1972 to 1915. Teams rally without the aid of maps or GPS but rather rely on the use of printed instructions that they receive the morning of each stage of the race. Teams start the rally portion of each day at a secluded location normally on a county road and leave at one minute intervals so it seems like they are each running the rally on their own.

Scoring is by how close each team crosses a secret check point to their perfect time. Like in golf the low score wins. The job of the navigator is to keep the team on course and to make time adjustments for maneuvers encountered on the course. For example: if the instructions read drive 45 MPH until you reach the next stop sign, pause for 15 seconds, and leave the stop sign at 40 MPH, the navigator needs to consult their charts to see how much time is lost slowing down from 45 to a stop as well as taking off to get back up to 40. The time lost is subtracted from the 15 second pause time so the real pause may only be 4 seconds.

Each car develops their own custom charts for starts, stops and turns. In a perfect world, each team will pass the check points at the exact second that they should and will receive an ACE for that leg of the race. A second early or a second late translates to one point and a negative and a positive do not offset each other.

Older cars receive a small advantage called a time factor to compensate for the issues of driving older equipment. The responsibility of the driver is to help the navigator keep an eye out for turns and signs for speed changes. The other responsibility of the driver is to try to keep a constant speed. Sometimes, we may need to drive 50 MPH for 40 minutes or 18 MPH for 10 minutes. Both can be difficult.

We do not know which roads that we will be traveling on. We usually rally on county roads sometimes using the same road multiple times. Each night there is a large car show, sometimes over 10,000 people. I hope that you have the opportunity to stop by and see the spectacular in either Erie, Medina or Perrysburg.
