Secretary Notes from the Fall Board Meeting 2022

The meeting was called to order by Director Darlynn Fink at 10:10 am. The director welcomed everyone, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll call was taken by Penn-Ohio Secretary Jim Ulle, 19 Chapter Representatives, 4 Former Directors and 3 members of Executive Board present. Penn-Ohio Treasurer, John Menches, was excused.

Minutes of 2021 Fall Board Meeting were read and approved with correction to website report with potential cost of \$45,000 changed to \$4,500 (Von Wolf). Motion to accept minutes as adjusted by AJ Pennington and seconded by Don Harvey, all in favor, motion carried.

Treasurer's report was presented by Jim Ulle on behalf of John Menches. It was reported that our current Net Income/(Loss) is at (\$-297.54) and is projected at about (-\$2,000) for the end of the year.

There are several chapters who have not reported the results of their Penn-Ohio meets and subsequent status of the \$1,000 advanced by Penn-Ohio. It was noted that this program was a 2-year trial period and needs to be visited.

It was also noted that the Treasurer and Secretary did not accept wages for 2022.

Also reported that although there were website construction costs of \$1,742 (one time cost), there will be continued maintenance costs in the future.

Overall Penn-Ohio is okay with \$40,260.42 on deposit, but additional income from increased membership, merchandise sales and meet participation should be considered.

One adjustment to report, Erie Chapter returned \$16 of Meet Advancement money in 2021, not Ridge Runners. Motion to accept report as corrected by AJ Pennington and seconded by Don Harvey, all in favor, motion carried.

Diana Stewart presented the Editor's Report. Diana reported that when she submits the Quail to the website there had been a delay in it being added online. This issue should go away with the new site and her ability to upload directly to the webpage. Diana requested contact info for ALL PRESIDENTS to be able to make notifications in a timely manner when necessary. Also reported that the JC Taylor ad has been reduced from a full page ad. Motion to accept the report as presented made by AJ Pennington and seconded by Chris Wolf, all in favor, motion carries.

Proposal 1 discussed by Jim Ulle. Discussion on changing Chapter Attendance Award to attendance by percentage of membership. Discussion of current disadvantage to small chapters. Proposal was tabled, to be re-presented at the Spring Banquet with modification to allow awards for "A" attendance and "Member" attendance, both based on percentage of membership. Gary Martin made the motion seconded by Tom Franzen.

Proposal 2 was discussed, would create separate printing for roster and by-laws/constitution. Discussion on all this being on the website in the future. Decision to separate the 2 printings, with the roster of 2023 to be prepared and distributed to the chapters in digital format so they can distribute to their membership. Proposal voted on and passed 22 to 1.

Proposal 3 presented by Jerry Balczon. Suggested creating a handbook (8 1/2" x 11") in bright color to include Constitution and by-laws, ntoes from editor, preventative maintenance, and driving tips/guidelines. After much discussion, the proposal was voted on and failed 19 to 2.

FALL BOARD MEETING, CONTINUED:

Proposal 4 to create membership roster on 8 1/2 "x 11" and issued annually was withdrawn.

Proposal 5 to remove year designation from "A" Quail Call deadlines was withdrawn.

Proposal 6 to have "A" Quail Call and Constitution and By-Laws printed "purpose" to match. Proposal withdrawn.

Break was called for at 11:35 am.

Reconvened at 11:50 am.

Chapter hosting assignments for 2023 were as follows.....
May - Copus Hill
June - possible tour (to be voted on in the spring)
July - Erie
August - Ridge Runners
September - Cranksters
October - Five Points

There are several tour possibilities that are being looked at by respective tour hosts. No details at this time, will be voted on in the spring.

AJ Pennington discussed the \$1,000 Penn-Ohio advance to host chapters, proposed reducing to \$500 for meets and \$1,000 for tours. After discussion, it was voted on to renew the program for 2023. Vote to continue one year was approved by majority with one opposed.

Chris Wolf asked about "A" Quail being emailed to representative of each chapter when it comes out so that they can forward to their chapter membership. This will be checked into. Also brought up chapters putting together lists of interesting location in their regions. Discussion was that this would be good item for the website.

Von Wolf brought up the idea of Penn-Ohio looking into becoming a Region of MARC. Talked about benefits to more exposure to potential members. He will pursue.

Gary Stewart talked about the development of the new website and the need for moderators. Von Wolf volunteered to work in that capacity.

Jim Ulle required ideas to deal with club history, several bins with notes and rosters as well as old blue cards. Consensus was to destroy records. Jim stated he would like to capture at least some info digitally before destroying the records but will be purging blue cards.

Von Wolf brought up the need for an Associate Director to Work with current Director Darlynn Fink and move into the Director's Position in 2024.

Motion was made to adjourn meeting by AJ Pennington with 2nd by Von Wolf, motion carried, meeting adjourned at 12:50 pm . Submitted by Jim Ulle, Penn-Ohio Secretary



Melvin, being our chapter historian, gave a brief presentation on the original forming and members at that time.


