





A good time was had by all.



After the lunch, we headed to the Bemus Point-Stow Ferry to take us across the lake to the Lawson Antique Boat Museum. Since 1811, the ferry has been carrying vehicles across the lake from Stow to Bemus Point. Once in Bemus Point, we all drove a very short distance to the Lawson Antique Boat Museum. The museum has one of the largest antique boat displays in the area. This center was originally the boat service center in 1918 and was owned by the Lawson Family. The family donated the building to Bemus Point in October 2010 for all to enjoy its boating history.

On the 3rd day of our tour, we checked out of our hotel and headed to the Chautauqua Institution. This is an educational and cultural center that was founded in 1847. The Antheneum Hotel which is displayed in the picture was built in 1881 and hosted such guests as Thomas Edison, who had a hand in wiring some of the original electric lights. A walk through this grand hotel will certainly call you back to its grandeur. The institution has become one of the most cultural and educational centers in the U.S. It offers popular entertainment, theater, symphony, ballet, opera and visual art exhibitions all through the summer. It's history and grounds are iconic and a must to see. A summer visit to this magical area is well worth seeing and a place to venture to in your Model A Ford!














## CRANKSTERS CORRESPONDENT: DAWN PAINTER


